Deep shades add allure

THE LIVING ROOM'S full-tilt blue wall showcases Colvin's spirited gallery—including everything from family photos to decoupage trays, surrounding a carved shelf—better than white ever could

One walk through the Austin home of Shawn Colvin, and it's clear that the three-time Grammy winner knows a thing or two about harmony. The stucco split-level Colvin, 57, shares with her 15-year-old daughter is an eclectic mash-up of colors and collections that are quirky but don't clash. Take the wildly different

but compatible hues: vibrant chartreuse on the kitchen cabinets, intense marine blue on the living room walls, and exotic Chinese red-orange on the library bookcases.
